We will continue to have a number of specialist additional teachers who will be working across the school:

- Billy continues as our full time sports coach for all year groups.
- Emanuela will continue to teach Dance to KS2 classes.
- Daniel will spend part of his week teaching Spanish in KS2.
- Charles will continue to provide reading, SEN and EAL support for some children
- Rebecca will be continuing one day a week as a Maths intervention teacher.
- Catherine will be spending part of her week teaching Year 4 and the rest as the school's SENDCo (Special Educational Needs Coordinator).

Next year

Welcomes (and returns) for September

We welcome back Simon Codling to the teaching team from September. Simon worked at Walnut Tree Walk for many years before taking up a new post at another school last year. However, we are delighted to say that he is returning to us and will be teaching Year 2 as well as joining the Senior Management Team as a Teaching and Learning Lead. Emma returned earlier in the June following her maternity leave, and will be teaching Year 5 next year.

I am pleased to say that Shifa will be undertaking her teacher training at our school next year. Gino has been appointed as a Cover Supervisor so will now be leading classes when teachers are absent short term. This will help to ensure that the children receive consistency and highquality teaching and learning from an experienced educator. We are hoping to appoint a new Premises Officer to start in September and are currently in the process of recruiting for this post.

Presents for staff at end of year and Christmas

We do not ever expect gifts from parents but know that some of you like to give a present at the end of the academic year. Whilst we are all enormously appreciative of the gesture, as Lambeth Council employees, we cannot accept high-value gifts. The collections that have taken place in recent years, whilst so kind and generous, do cross that threshold, so we will no longer be able to accept these gift cards. If you would like to buy staff members a gift, small tokens of your appreciation (bought individually from parents) are appropriate but never expected.

Breakfast and After School Club Booking for September

Booking for next half-term (September and October) will go live on Monday 2nd September at 11am. We cannot open the booking any earlier as we have to wait for the new Reception children to be registered so that the Reception parents have the same access to it. We have increased capacity (yet again!). Despite the significant increasing costs of operating this provision, I am pleased to say that we will be able to maintain our current prices for next term. This is something that we are reviewing termly to ensure that the club is sustainable.

Summer Work - Donations

Over the summer we will be having quite a lot of building work done; the main project this year is our redevelopment of the back playground/ sports pitch, pictures of which you can see on the next page. This new and improved pitch area will mean there is better play space for lunch and playtimes as well as much-improved space for Billy's PE sessions. From September we will be able to do the vast majority of our PE lessons on site rather than relying on (and paying for) the pitches at Lollard Street Adventure Playground.

This is a project that is costing a substantial amount of money and is something that we have been saving up for. A few parents have made very kind donations to the school over the last year - either personally or through the companies that they work for.
