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Attendance Policy update

For full details of our Attendance Policy, this will be added to our website soon. A summary of some important points and changes:

Why is attendance so important?

1. Impact on attainment and progress

Good attendance very closely correlates with good outcomes. Children who do not attend school regularly fall behind their peers and do not achieve as well as they should, impacting negatively on their life chances.

2. Pupil wellbeing and friendships

Children who regularly miss school can experience more difficulties with their confidence and wellbeing, including developing friendships.

3. Sequencing of lessons

Lessons are carefully sequenced across a week, meaning that if a child misses a day earlier in the week, they may find it challenging to keep up with the work their peers are doing later in the week.

4. Lessons start promptly at 9am

eg. children in KS1 have their daily phonics lesson at 9am. This is a really important lesson as it provides the foundations for children to be

How has the new government guidance changed?

Holidays can no longer be authorised during term time unless in exceptional circumstances.

Children attending visits to secondary schools are counted as an absence (previously it was not).

If children are later than 9:25am, it is marked as a code U which counts as an absence for that session. Children who arrive after 9am but before 9:25am continue to be marked as code L which counts as attending, but late.

When a school becomes aware that the national threshold has been met for an individual child, the school must work with the local authority to decide if a penalty notice should be issued. The national threshold is a child being absent for 10 sessions (5 days) within 10 school weeks for an unauthorised reason (this could be due to a holiday, lateness, unexplained absences or a combination of these).

What the school will be doing to promote good attendance?

We will continue to work directly with families where there are attendance concerns and offer support where we can.

If we do not hear from a parent when the child is absent, we will call all emergency contacts and, on occasions, may visit the family home.

We will be using something called Studybugs which will automatically notify school leaders of any specific attendance concerns or patterns so that prompt action can be taken. Studybugs will also send notification emails to parents.

We will be working closely with Lambeth's Education Welfare Service to address any attendance concerns we have.

What can parents do to support?

Ensure that your child is in school every day and on time unless they are too unwell to attend.

Keep the school informed. Please call the school each day your child is absent, giving the reason. We are not allowed to authorise absences where we are just told the child is unwell; we need to know what the illness is.

Try to avoid medical and dentist appointments during the school day (where possible). If they are during the school day, try to ensure that your child is in school for the registration at 9am (and 1pm/1:30pm).

Do not take term time holidays.
